#### PREFACE & ACKNOWLEDGEMENTS

The Adair family history has been the subject of several publications. Emmett Starr's HISTORY OF THE CHEROKEE INDIANS, published in 1921 delineates many Adair families. James Barnett Adair's book ADAIR HISTORY AND GENEALOGY, published in 1924, is a good overall look at many early Adair families. THE GEORGIANS(1986) by Jeannette Holland Austin explores several families and Mrs. M. Adair Dabbs of Clarksdale, Ms.'s Supplement of 1976 to Alexander DuBill's FIVE HUNDRED FIRST FAMILIES OF AMERICA is recommended reading for Adair researchers.

My purpose is to explore connections of Adair families that came to America before the Revolution and then to follow their migration westward to Tennessee, Mississippi, Texas and Indian Territory. Also, the goal was to record as much current information about descendents as possible. Readers are encouraged to send corrections, additions for future revisions.

From North and South Carolina, the **Thompson family** migrated (along with Sellers, Carroll, and Lawson families) to north central Alabama before the Civil War. A rich heritage underlies these families and only the surface has been scratched in this work. Present-day descendents were very generous in their support of this publication, however, and research continues.

This publication barely touches the deep history of Beauchamp, Casey and Nave families. Hopefully, it will encourage others to examine and **record** their knowledge and findings on our ancestors whose roots go far back into our nation's history.



# **ADAIR**

#### HISTORY OF THE NAME

Scotch, Irish, English!! People of the Adair name are probably all of these. Fitzgerald (thought to be the true Irish name), descended from Walter, son of Other, who at the Domesday Survey(1086) was tenant-in-chief of 5 counties of England, according to Samuel Cole Williams, author of a book about James Adair, the Indian Trader.

Viking/Norman people landed in Northern Scotland & the Orkneys about 870 A.D., but these early inhabitants were soon challenged by another wave of Normans led by William, Duke of Normandy in 1066. These followers of the Duke of Normandy had become dissatisfied with their southern holdings and marched north where they were given large Scottish estates. This invasion displaced the earlier families, encouraging their flight to Southern Ireland. Included were people who settled in Ath-Dare(in southern Ireland), and who later took the name Athdare, Adare, Adair, Odeir, Edgar, etc.

Adair is from the Gaelic or Celtic: Ath(a ford) and dair(oak tree). Literally, it means ford (bridge) at the oak tree.

Adare (county Limerick) in southern Ireland, as the story goes, once had a great oak tree which shaded the ford (a bridge built in 1390), and in ancient times, crossed the Maigue River. More recent evidence indicates a settlement there as early as the 11th century.

Robert, a descendent of the Irish Fitzgerald family, killed a kinsman over the succession to his grandfather's estate. The duel caused an uproar and Robert was forced to flee about 1380 to Galloway, Scotland. Family legend states he took as his name, the place where the duel occurred (Adare). At Galloway, Robert married Arabella Campbell of the Scottish house of Argyle.

From the 15-17th Century, Scotland was ravaged by religious tyranny; conflicts between church and state created unrest, causing an exodus (sometimes involuntarily) of people to Ireland. Scottish Lowlanders (particularly from Galloway) were shipped to Ulster, where many settled in county Antrim (esp. at Ballymena) in Northern Ireland.

Many of our Adair families came to the New World from Ireland in the early 1700's; the migration continued over the next 150 years.

# Thomas Adair Ireland - America (1680-1750c)

Individuals named Adair began migration to America during the mid 1700's; they came from Ulster counties in (Northern) Ireland, and from Galloway, Scotland," wrote Dr.James Barnett Adair in his 1924 book Adair History & Genealogy. Adair's studies indicate these Adairs stopped in Maryland, New Jersey, and (in larger numbers) Pennsylvania, later scattering to South Carolina and other southern states.

Thomas Adair (b. 1680c) came from county Antrim in Ireland about 1730 to Chester County, Pa. He is known to have three sons (James, Joseph, William) born in Ireland. Son James Adair acquired a land patent in what is now Lauren County, S. C., where he established Adair Colony. Waxaw Colony was established east of this colony by other Scotch-Irish settlers from Pa. Adair Colony was probably considered part of that larger and better-known South Carolina settlement.

During our country's struggle for independence, Adairs joined the American side with at least ten Adairs in the war from S.C. Thomas' son, Joseph Adair, Sr., was commissary in Col. Casey's Regiment at age seventy.

This researcher believes that Robert Adair, subject of this book, is a grandson of Joseph Adair, Sr. who died in Laurens, SC in 1801, buried in Duncan Creek Grave Yard.

Joseph Adair, Sr.'s 1788 will, filed in that county, (Bk. A, Page 19) reads:

I give and bequeath to my wife, Susanna (Long), all cattle, hogs, and pewter; \$160 Continental Dollars, all grain, farming tools, beds and bedsteads

I give to my sons, James and Joseph Jr., the remainder of the Continental money, Imported bedsteads, and arm chairs.

I give to my son Benjamin, half of my Cooper tools; also twenty pounds old currency.

I give to my daughters, Leah(Jean) Ramage, Sarah Adair, and Mary Owens, each twenty pounds old currency. Robert Long, SL.

Wit: Jas.Montgomery, Wm. Bourland, Jas. Creek

Signed Joseph Adair, Sr.

## I. Joseph Adair, Jr. (1733-1812)

Joseph Adair, Jr., born in Pa., was about 17 yrs. when his family moved to South Carolina. Joseph, Jr., who was with Col. Lacy at Hauk's defeat in the Rev. War, (according to Dr. Adair) had the following children:

Joseph Adair, Jr. died at age 79, and is buried(like his father) in Duncan Creek graveyard.

Recorded at the Laurens Courthouse, S.C. (Deed Bk. D-1, Pg. 105) is Joseph Adair's will, written 20 January 1812, as follows:

I will to my son John Adair one parcel of land.

To my son James Adair one tract of land

To my son Robert Adair money received from land sale to Alex. Wilkerson and silver breeches buttons

To Elisha Adair, my son, one tract of land.

To grandson Joseph Adair, Elisha's son, silver coat buttons and silver breeches buttons.

To Elizabeth Adair Houston, my daughter, one Negro girl

To Jane Adair Holland, my daughter, one Negro girl

To Casy Adair McCrary, my daughter, one Negro woman

To Charity Adair Little, my daughter, one Negro Woman Signed, Joseph Adair

Witnesses: Richard Holland, William Adair, George McCrary. Will was proven 15 January 1813.

Robert Adair (probably son of Joseph Adair, Jr.) is our focus as we search for connections to this early South Carolina family. Robert Adair, born about 1770 in SC, married 10 May 1800, Green Co., Georgia; Robert Was named on 1811 Morgan Co., Ga. documents involving brother John, and settled from c1830-45 in Tennessee and died in Mississippi.

Dr. J. B. Adair wrote in 1924 that Robert Adair (Joseph's son) was a bachelor school teacher who settled in Bedford Co., Tenn. One of Robert's pupils was Isham G. Harris (b. 1818c) who became a Confederate General and U.S. Senator from Tennessee.

No Adair's were found in **Bedford Co.**, Tenn., between 1820-1840. However, adjoining **Franklin Co.**, Tenn., 1830 census, yielded a Robert Adair (age 50-60), another male(age 15-20), 3 young females and a female age 40-50. (**This is our subject Adair family**). Additional research in Tennessee history and census records indicates that the Harris' family (mentioned by Dr. Adair) was also in Franklin County in 1820, moving to western Tenn. (Madison Co.) by 1830 and then to Shelby Co. (Memphis) in the Civil War era.

Robert Adair married Babsy Reid in 1800, Greene County, Ga. Few Adair references exist 1800-1820, Greene County, Ga.

## Green Co., Georgia Records

Benjamin Adair, planter of Laurens Co., SC (Jos. Adair, Jr's brother) sold 322 acres on Oconee River to Henry Allison, Esq. on 31 March 1790.

John Adair sold (15 Sep 1801) 120 ac. on waters of Greenbrier (Joseph Hughey's land) to Edward Daniel.

Robert F. Adair participated in 1805 land lottery, Stewart District.

#### Morgan County, Georgia records:

Robert F. and John Adair on 22 July 1811 promised to pay William Wilkins; Wilkins sued for payment.

Jane Adair obtained letter of administration, 3 May 1813, for John Adair's estate. Brother Elisha Adair in Laurens Co., SC. was estate executor.

Farmer, John, and William Adair (John Adair & Jane Fisher's children) were in 1817 Morgan Co.lottery.

# Franklin County, Tennessee Records

Robert Adair's daughter Julia was born c1812 in Tennessee. No census records are available before 1830 for Franklin Co. Robert Adair was not on the 1820 Franklin Co. tax records.

- 31 Aug 1832 County Court deed of conveyance from John W. Williams to John W. Holder for two tracts of land. Proven by oaths of Robert Adair and Hugh Montgomery
- 1837 Robert & Elisha Adair, land entry on Bradley Creek (Shelbyville), White Co., Tenn.
- 29 May 1839 Tenn. land grant #6723 for 1806 acres to Robert & Elisha G. Adair (adj. Coffee Co.)

Although at least three of Robert Adair's children were married in Tenn., only Mary B. Adair's marriage to Jonathon Ellis in Franklin Co., Tenn. has been located. In 1830 Robert's oldest son, Sebrem Scott, was married and living in Henderson Co., Tenn. Sebrem's brother, William Elbert Adair, was in Sebrem's home.

Robert Adair's family migrated about 1845 from Franklin Co., Tennessee to Tishimingo Co., Mississippi, along with his sons Sebrem Scott, William Elbert, and Elisha Garland Adair.

# Robert Adair's children in Mississippi

Sybil Adair, descendent of Elisha Garland Adair(1810-1885), wrote in a letter to the author in 1976: "My father, Lesley Quitman Adair(age 85), is a son of Issac Green, who was a son of Elisha Garland, who was a son of Robert Adair."


"Between 1840 and 1850 Elisha and his family moved to Mississippi and his father (Robert Adair) came with him. While they were still living in the covered wagon before they built their home, Robert took sick and died. He is buried in an old cemetary in Tippah County."

When Elisha married(1858 in Tish. Co., Miss.), S. S. Adair is listed on the license as a witness. Sybil further wrote that "Older members of the family remember their parents speaking of Uncle Sebern." Elisha G., William E., Sebrem, and sister Mary Adair Ellis all lived near each other in the 1850-1870's in Mississippi, giving additional credibility to their being Robert Adair's children.

#### PART I - THOMAS ADAIR(1680-1750c)

Sometime after the 1870 census, Robert Adair's family moved to Covington, (Tipton County) Tenn. But the family moved again before 1878 (when James Emerson's son Willard was born) to Texas. Robert William and James Emerson Adair are both found in Johnson Co., Tex. in 1880. James Emerson's children moved to Hunt County about 1890. In 1900 one of Elisha Garland Adair's children (John B. Adair) was also in Hunt Co., Tx.

Although several of Robert W. Adair's children went north to Indian Territory along the Red River before 1900, Robert W. Adair and his wife are listed with son James T. Adair and wife Lillie (married 5 years) and daughter Robbie T. at Grandview, (Johnson Co., Tx. in 1900. (Ed 64, Sheet 8, Pct. 5).

- E. Robert William Adair (Sebrem's son) has been found in various records as: William R.; Robert W.R.; Robert W.; R. W. Adair. Robert W. Adair was born 22 Jan 1835, (1833, per 1900 census) Henderson Co., Tenn. He married 12 Dec 1854 (Tish Co., Miss) Leuritta M. (Malinda) C. E.B. Worley (b. 19 March 1840 (1842, per 1900 census) Tenn, d. 18 Oct 1902, Boswell, Ok.). Robert died 13 Jan 1927, Boswell, Okla. Both are buried at Restland Cem., Choctaw Co. Okla.

Robert Adair was living in Tishimingo Co., Mississippi when he married Leuritta M. Worley. Her father was Leonard Worley who was born c1798 in South Carolina; Leuritta's mother, Anna \_\_\_\_\_, b.1804c in Ga. In 1840, Leonard Worley was in Hardeman Co., Tenn. The adjoining county of Hardin lists George Worley(b.c1765), who may be Leonard Worley's father. Paul Worley has also been suggested as Leonard's father. John Worley(b.1795), Abraham Worley(b.1795), and Michael Worley(b.1805c) were also in Hardin Co. and may be brothers of Leonard Worley.

Leonard and Anna Worley's children included: George, Moses, Narcissa, Nancy, Leuritta, Martha, Calvin, Charlotte (1850 Tish.Co., Miss.Census). Riley Worley(another son?) lives nearby, as does Allen Glover(b.1813, Ga.) and wife Sarah) No Worley family was found in 1860 census of Tish. Co.

Mississippi, a fast growing frontier in the early 1800's, grew rapidly after two thirds of its area was ultimately ceded in 1830's by the Indians. An aristocratic and somewhat feudal society was supported by an economy based on slavery. Election of Lincoln and secession of South Carolina prompted Mississippi's secession on January 9, 1861. President of the Confederate States of America was Mississippi's former U.S. Senator, Jefferson Davis, who became president of the Confederate States of America.

Corinth, Mississippi, approximately 15 miles from where the Adair family farmed from 1850-1870, was headquarters for the Confederate Army in 1862. Confederate General Pierre G.T. Beauregard retreated to Corinth in April 1862 after the Battle of Shiloh. In late May after several small skirmishes within a mile of Corinth, Beauregard slipped out of the city and the Yanks took over Corinth without opposition.

War truly came to the Adair's farm gate in October of 1862, however, when the Rebel Army (in an attempt to oust Grant's Union troops from West Tennessee), marched against Unionheld Corinth. Outmanned 2-1, the Confederates retreated, suffering almost 5000 casualties at Corinth.

Robert Adair was not with his family during this time as he had enlisted at Dry Run (Silver Springs) in the Confederate army on March 1, 1862. Enlistment papers show Robert to be a 26 year old farmer born in Tennessee (Lexington, according to pension papers) with a wife Leuretta (22 years old) and 2 sons (Leonard age 7; James, age 5), and one year old daughter Sarah. Leaving his family under the care of his father Sebrem Adair and other family member, Robert was paid a \$50 bounty by Col. W. C. Falkner for his three year enlistment in Company A.

Company A was successively called: Capt. Boone's Co.; Capt. James M. Leeth's Co.; Tishomingo Riflemen of 2nd Mississippi Infantry Volunteers; Robert was paid by Major G.W. Jones until Sep. 1862 when Capt. M. Suratt paid the men. Robert was transferred on April 30th to Company L (Liberty Guards), Second regiment of Miss. Volunteers. On Nov. 2, 1862, he returned to Co. A.

After his injury furlough, Robert served in Company C of Harris Battalion Cavalry(Ham's Regiment), division of Mississippi State Troops from Sep. 18, 1863 - Sep. 16, 1864

Robert's first battle was far from home in defense of Richmond, the Confederate capitol.

#### CIVIL WAR ENGAGEMENTS

Battles in the Civil War (South called it "War between the States") had two names. The South named battles for towns and forts, the North for rivers and mountains.

May 31, - June 1, 1862, Battle of Seven Pines (Fair Oaks, Va.) was not a victory for either side. Although the South possessed superior troop numbers and positions, a series of errors and events undermined their effort. Failure to issue written orders led to misunderstandings among the leaders. On one battle flank, less than half of the available Confederate brigades were committed to battle. After commanding General J.E. Johnston was wounded, General Robert E. Lee arrived to take command, but Rebel morale was dampened.

June 1862 - Gaines Farm(Seven Days Battle)
With over 80,000 troups including those under Gen. Stonewall
Jackson's command, a Confederate victory was achieved at
this battle 8 miles northeast of Richmond, Va. Confederate
losses, however, were almost double those of the Union.

July 1, 1862 - Malvern Hill - Part of the Seven Days Battle A defeat for the Rebels, but Richmond was saved.

Aug.29-30th, 1862 - Manassas (Second Battle of Bull Run)
Cunning of General Lee and bungling by Northern generals led
to a decisive Rebel victory. Lee's army had driven the
adversary out of Virginia!

#### Sep. 1862 - Boonsboro, Maryland

Sept 17, 1862 Sharpsburg, Maryland - Battle of Antietam
Battle of Antietam was one of the most decisive battles of
the Civil war. It was the climax and end of the first
Confederate invasion of the North. This battle was also
known as the day more men were killed or wounded than any
other day of the entire Civil War. From General Lee's
entire force of 40,000 men(all actively deployed), about
10,000 were casualties: killed, wounded, captured or missing
- one fourth of their entire strength. Although Union
troops suffered similar casualties, over 1/3 of the troops
present were not actively engaged in battle. Southern hopes
were at highest after this "victory."

July 1-3, 1863 - Battle of Gettysburg, Pa.

Historians call this the greatest battle of the war,
occurring in a little country town in southeastern
Pennsylvania. It was the war's turning point and could have

resulted in an early war's end, if the Union's commander General George G. Meade had followed up the resounding victory in hot pursuit of the defeated Southern forces.

Running low on ammunition, a Confederate gunnery officer advised Major General George Pickett to come quickly or "my ammunition will not let me support you properly." Bravely, Pickett responded by leading Confederate troups on July 3 against the Union center.

From a curtain of trees "extending along Seminary Ridge came a striking sight: 15,000 men in gray, with no less than 42 regimental colors waving, advanced in columns of attack." Almost a mile wide, the advance moved about 200 yards with hardly a shot fired. Union soldiers behind stone walls along Cemetery Ridge "watched in amazement and admiration at the courage of their foe."

Then the full fury of amply-supplied Federal artillery opened from scores of massed guns.
"Flags began to waver and fall; behind the still advancing ranks, dead and writhing men littered the ground."

Encyclopedia Americana

Confederate casualties were extremely heavy, only one of Pickett's field officers found his way back to the lines.

Lee's badly defeated army was forced to retreat, but his pontoon bridge across the Potomac was destroyed by Union troops and torrential rain stranded his army. Finally on July 13th the Potomac River fell and a makeshift bridge was built for wagon trains while the troops forded the river.

It was in this Battle of Gettsbury that Robert Adair received a gunshot wound to the middle third of his right thigh. "Wounded and left at Gettysburg" was crossed off his military record. Records show that he was registered on 15 July 1863 at Receiving and Wayside Hospital (Gen. Hospital #9, Richmond, Va.). He was transfered to Chimborazo Hospital #5, Richmond, Virgina; Robert was furloughed home a month later on 15 August 1863.

Recuperating about thirty days, Robert enlisted on 18 September 1863 at Booneville, Miss. in Co. C of Harris Battalion Cavalry (a division of the Mississippi State Troops). He was elected 2nd Lieutenant of Ham's Regiment of the Cavalry in October. This regiment was formed from Harris's Battalion.

### PART I - ROBERT W. ADAIR(1835 - 1927)

Because paperwork was not completed for Robert's transfer to the Harris Battalion, he was reported in desertion from his old Company A, from August 15th, 1863 - February 14, 1864. Robert had another son named William Robert Adair, born in June 1864; Robert served a year in Ham's Regiment before his resignation, dated September 16, 1864. Military records gave Robert's physical description as 5'4", with dark hair, eyes and complexion.

Robert served under the command of Lt. R. E. Clayton, Major G.W. Jones, and Capt Surutt, before his thigh injury at Gettysburg.


Information for this section came from Robert William Adair's military records, several volumes of **Encyclopedia Americana**, and various Civil War books

After the Civil War, Robert William Adair (called Uncle Bob) lived in Mississippi until 1874 (Prentiss Co.,1870), when his family moved to Covington, Tennessee (Tipton Co.), remaining until 1879. He and his family then migrated to Cleburne (Johnson Co.), Texas. Son Henry Rollen was born there in 1881. Moving north to Indian Territory in the 1890's, Robert's son Leonard Scott Adair died 17 Sep 1898 and was buried in Lone Grove, recorded in R.W. Adair's family Bible. In 1900 R.W. Adair and his wife were listed with son J.T. Adair in Grandview, Tx. (Johnson Co.).

After wife Leuritta's death in 1901, Robert (Uncle Bob) spent the last 25 years of his life with youngest son Henry Rollen, whose children recall many fond memories of their Grandpa Adair. As a young boy, Joe H. Adair remembers standing behind his Grandpa who was sitting on the porch in his favorite rocking chair, with walking cane close at hand. Hoping to catch his Grandpa unawares, Joe abruptly found the cane briskly rapping his head. Towards the end of his life, children and grandchildren often came for visits, but Robert usually requested only immediate family assist at his sickbed.

R.W. Adair's Confederate Application of 1911 in Okla.for a pension stated he was born in Lexington, Tenn. and had lived in Oklahoma 23 years. His pension was approved on July 1, 1915.

James Walter Adair was at age 18, a double-handed baseball pitcher on a Dallas team. As a young man, he drove cattle from the blue-stem grass of Texas to Kansas City, then north to Wyoming. After his father's death, James (J.W.) lived with an Alabama family in Indian Territory. On the June 1, 1900 Chickasaw Nation census, James is listed as a 20 year old boarder in Wiley Thompson's home.

Thompson's married daughter, Trannie Carroll (age 18) and her husband (Oscar Carroll) are also in the household. one year, the Carroll's had no children, according to the About six weeks after the census (dated July 14, 1900), James W. Adair married Trannie Carroll at Keller in Southern Dist. of Ind. Territory. Oral history states that Oscar Carroll was killed in an oilfield fire at "Ragtown" and his widow Trannie then married J.W. Adair.

Oscar Lee Adair always gave his birthdate as August 10, 1899 in McAla, Alabama (including a delayed birth certificate and school records). Inaccuracies in census records probably suggest that baby Oscar L. Carroll was inadvertently omitted from the census record, but no document has yet been found for definite proof of this premise. Some relatives stated that Oscar was not treated well by J.W. Adair, to be a difficult man to please and who seemed to enjoy belittling both men and women. Women especially felt threatened and vulnerable around James W. Adair, according to some relatives. Thompson and Carroll families are outlined in Part II, page 140.

J. W. Adair was cattle driving when son Leonard was born in Growing up, Leonard felt he was given less respect and attention than Oscar Lee; at the age of 18 or 19, Leonard enlisted in the Army, first being rejected by the After leaving home, Leonard rarely wrote his family and almost disappeared. He sent a wire upon learning of his mother's death. Probably Leonard lived in California where it is believed he raised two boys, reported to be in police work in California.

Three of J.W.'s children died young: Hubert, Archie (Artie's twin), and Ila at age four from "brain congestion from chewing green cane." PR's had diptheria (caught from a cat, it was said). To help in his recovery, the family decided to move to the mountain area of Arkansas near Ft. Smith.

Growing up, Homer and Wayland worked in oilfields and later as night deputies. After a Calif. trip, Homer embarked on an 18 year career helping the homeless at Dallas Baptist Mission. Lewell worked at various investments in Ft. Smith, Ark., before his death. His widow Helen and only child live in Louisiana.

Wayland, a retired electrician, and his family live around McAlster, Ok. Warren Scott, who often chaproned his older sister Artie as teenagers, lived in Calif. before his death. PR was a stock broker and resided in the Phoeniz area before his death.

Lewell Adair's widow Helen lives in the Little Rock, Arkansas area near their one daughter Shirley.

Artie Mae, twin to Archie, married a man her father didn't approve of (he was 15 yrs. older and had been married before) so they eloped one spring. J.W. remained upset for quite along time - she was his only daughter!! Artie raised a large family on limited resources, as did many families during the depression. Widowed with two daughters still at home, Artie's spirit never lagged; her sunny nature is still a joy to all who know her. She lives with daughter Helen Kitchens in Okla. City.







Rabbit was only 7 years old when his father died. As a young man he built a taxi-like buggie called a hack and drove for hire out of a livery. While doing this work, he met his future wife Bertha. After their marriage they lived near Boswell and Rabbit (with Bertha's help), chopped trees and made railroad ties. It was while cutting trees that he caught pneumonia and was taken to Buddy (H.R.) Adair's home. However, the doctor arrived too late to save him, and he died at age 41, leaving 5 small children.

Bertha began washing for people and the children started working at chopping & picking cotton, corn and peanuts, making less than a dollar a day. In a 1993 interview with her granddaughter Tanya McCoy, Rabbit's daughter Pauline described the hardness of the times for their family. "She (Pauline) had tears in her eyes as she talked about her father and even though she was only seven when he died, she still remembers that day like it was yesterday."

Because they had no car, the children often walked 5 miles to a field and then home again, sometimes after dark. Tanya's interview, a school project to interview someone in their 70's who had lived during the depression, related that Rabbit's family lived in a 4 room house with no electricity or indoor plumbing and water came from a spring about 1/4 mile away.

After the fall crops were in, Bertha took her children to the Joplin area where some of her family lived; but they soon returned to Boswell area where the children grew up.

The following statistical exhibit was approved, and ordered printed in the minutes.

#### STATISTICAL EXHIBIT.

The Presbytery has 28 organized churches; one thission station; houses of worship, 15; manses, 2; 3 churches have preaching twice per month, 25 only once. There are 9 organized Sunday schools, and only 11 chur les have weekly prayer meetings. One Senior Christian Ludeavor Society, 4 missionary and 3 Aid Societies.

There are 18 ordained ministers on the roll, A licentiates

and 3 candidates.

The total number of ruling elders in the Leisbytery is 110; deacons, 28. The number of adult baptisms in 1902 was 50; infant, 16. The number of additions to the church by examination was 56; by letter, 62. The lot I number of resident members in the Presbytery is 844, on-resident, 230. The Presbytery has a Sunday school anembership of 376.

The total amount paid to pastors and supplies in 1902 was \$2,050.00. Total value of church property, \$16,655.00. During the year \$1,183,00 was expended in building and repairing. Miscellaneous expenditures, \$28.00. Total offerings for church enterprises, \$217.00.

Made offerings to church enterprises through my home church at Alvard. Have no work, but am holding meetings as opportunity offers.

J. A. Elder,-No charge; sermons preached, over 12; prayer meetings conducted, very many; pastoral visits, many. No many hath hired me for future work.





Mary remembered she "walked in Uncle's shadow until school started and he took me home." Uncle Adair died the following year and his neice felt the loss of a very special friend.

B. enforcement officer, was shot four times on the streets of Boswell Saturday about 12:80 o'clock by Jim Cutshaw, 26d died at 7:40 Sunday morning Cutsban was slightly wounded by one bullet from Adair's pis tol, the bullet striking him in the side and glancing under the skin, being removed near his spinal column. Adair only fired two shots, the other one going wild. Cutshaw fired five shots, four taking effect in Adalr's o'le en I thigh.

#### ADAIR-WEEKS

Jane Adair (born 1844) and Benjamin T Weeks (born 1340) were married March 28 1858. To this happy union were born twelve children. They were Ellen, Jim, Mack, Oliver (born 1870), Lucy, Etter (born 1874), John (born 1877) Anna, Emma, Daisy, Will, and Ben. Being quite young at the outbreak of the Civil War, B.T. Weeks served his native land as a Confederate water-boy. As the War progressed and the Confederacy was falling, Mr. Weeks and a comrade left three Union prisioners, who were assigned to kill, to go free. After the civil strife was terminated, one of these three men contacted B.T. Weeks and inspired him to become a medical doctor. This gentleman provided Mr. Weeks a home while he attended Vanderbilt University in Nashville, Tennessee. For many years B.T. Weeks returned to Vanderbilt to further his education, and each time he attended the university, Mr. Weeks' physical needs were met by the freed Union soldier and his family.

B.T. Weeks spent a long and useful life practicing medicine in his home community. Jane Adair Weeks and her older children ran a large country store, which was located near the Charley Geno place. With both husband and wife working, the Weeks family accumulated between six and seven hundred acres of land in the Western part of the country. The late Tice Moore bought the Weeks land after a tornado devestated all physical structures on the farm. With the loss of their home and being in ill health, B.T. and Jane Weeks moved to the Osborne Community to live with B.T. Weeks, Jr. and Warrene Gardner

Most of the Weeks children left this area and lived in Tennessee and Texas. Three of the Weeks off-spring lived in Prentiss County. Mack Weeks, an extremely successful farmer, lived in the Blackland Community. He was the husband of two wives and the father of four children. Quay Weeks, who was a farmer, mechanic, and carpenter, has spent his life in the Blackland area. Quay Weeks married Wilmetta Bartlett. From this union came Orville, Junior, Bernice and Marty Weeks. Orville is deceased, but the other children live in Prentiss County. Mary Lewis Weeks, daughter of Mack Weeks, married the late Al Morris, and they had one son. Mary Morris presently resides in the Blackland Community. Quinton Weeks, son of the late Mack Weeks, spent his life in Oklahoma. Little is known about Quinton Weeks. He died about five years ago. Maxine Weeks, the youngest child of Mack and Jessie Weeks, lives on part of the Mack Weeks' estate. Maxine married L.L. McAlpin, and they had four children: Mike, Joe, Cathy, and Jill McAlpin. Will Weeks, the son of B.T. Weeks, lived in the Pisgah and Jumpertown area. Will worked for the telephone company and farmed. He was married and the father of four children. These children were Roy Weeks, Merrill Weeks, Herman Weeis, and Bernice Weeks. They all lived and worked in Prentiss County.

The youngest child of B.T. and Jane Weeks was B.T. Weeks, Jr., who married Warrene Gardner. They had two daughters: Helen and Louree. B.T., Jr. spent his life farming and trading in timber. He was quite successful in these ventures. In 1947, B was elected to the Mississippi House of Representatives. Serving from 1948 until 1952, Mr. Weeks was instrumental in establishing the N.E.M.J.C. in Booneville, B.T. and Warrene Weeks are both deceased. Their elder daughter Helen Mitchell lives on a farm near Hamilton. Mississippi. L.L. Mitchell and Helen Weeks were married and they had five children and all are successful in their chose endeavors. L.L. Mitchell was a farmer and Helen is a housewife. L.L. Mitchell died in 1968, and Helen is presently living alone. The youngest daughter of B.T. and Warrene Weeks, Louree Weeks Jones, now resides in the city of Booneville.

Omar W. Jones and Louree Weeks Jones were married and they produced two offsprings: Omar B. Jones and Betty Jones Bingham, Louree Jones, a homemaker, had diversified interests, which included a long and rewarding career teaching school in Prentiss County. This career lasted for 34 years. Being retired at the present time, she takes an active partin church work and homemaking.

Adair was a place name in County Limerick, Ireland. Derived from the Celtic and Gaelic, Athdara, it literally means the ford of the oak tree. Robert FitzGerald de Adair was the victor in a duel fought there in the XIV Century. Afterwards he fled to Galloway, Scotland, where he became known as Robert Adair, the founder of the family and first to bear the name. Some of his descendants later returned to Ireland and lived in County Antrim. From there, about 1730, Thomas Adiar (b. about 1680) migrated to Chester County, Penn. He brought with him three sons: James (b. 1709), trader with the Indians and author of The History of the American Indians; Joseph (b. 1711); and William (b. 1719). They became the fathers of the three main families of Adairs in America. They spent 20 years in Penn., then joined the Waxaw Colony of Scotch-Irish settlers who migrated to South Carolina between 1750 and 1755. They settled near Duncan's Creek in Laurens County.

Joseph Adair, Sr. (b. 1711, d. 1801) was a soldier in the Revolutionary War and Commissary of Co. D. Casey's Regiment at age 70. He was married twice: first Sarah Laferty; second, Susanna Long. His oldest son, Joseph, Jr., (b. 1733, d. 1812, buried in Duncan's Creek Cemetery) was also a soldier in the Revolutionary War and was with Col. Lacy at Hauk's defeat. He married Sarah Dillard and had eight children.

Robert Adair (b. 1772, d. 1846, buried in Paul's Chapel Cemetery, Tippah Co.) was a son of Joseph, Jr. He was a school teacher. He married Babsey Reed. Their children were Sebron, Elbert, Emily, Julia, Patsey, Belle, and Elisha Garland.

Elisha Garland Adair (b. Nov. 7, 1810; d. Feb. 5, 1885; buried in Carolina Cemetery, Prentiss Co.) married three times. His first wife was Mary Bibb of Georgia (b. 1820, d. 1856). Their children were William, Jane Walker, America, John, and Onie. Part of this family moved from Tennessee to Mississippi near Jumpertown about 1846. While they were camped in covered wagons, Elisha's father, Robert, died. Elisha's second wife was Mary Fletcher McHassey (b. 1828, d. 1873, buried in Carolina Cemetery), daughter of Robert and Nancy Harliss McHaffey. Their children were Hattie, Cordelia, Reuben, Isaac "Ike", Elisha Hilliard, and Lattie (died age seven). Elisha and his third wife, Mary Gary, had no children.

Hattie Adair married Abe Frasier; Cordelia Adair married Jim Carpenter; Reuben Adair married Eula Wren. These with their families moved away from Prentiss County.

"Ike" Adair married Annie Jennings, daughter of John C. Jennings. They had two sons: Claude, who married Ophelia Avery, no children; Lesley, who married Annie V. Gambrell. Their daughter, Sybil Adair, lives in Memphis

Elisha Hilliard Adair (b. Aug. 27, 1866; d. Nov. 8, 1923) married Mary Edna Jennings (b. Jan. 25, 1868; d. Mar. 22, 1946), daughter of John C. Jennings. Both are buried in Carolina Cemetery. Their children were Leola, Guy, Ruby, Raymond Clinton (died in childhood), and Hermon. Elisha Hilliard was a faithful member of Carolina Methodist Church where he served as a steward. He was a brickyard operator, store owner, and carpenter. He also cured and stored sweet potatoes for the producers. He and his son, Guy, were among the first farmers to grow English peas and tomatoes for shipping and also to grow sweet potato and tomato plants for sale. Guy became widely recognized for his skill in plant growing.

Leola Adair (b. Sept. 28, 1888; d. Jan. 20, 1977) married S. T. Dandridge (b. Mar. 4, 1891). Their only child, Doris, died in infancy. For a time they lived in Memphis where S. T. "Terry" was employed by A.D.T. but returned to Booneville after retirement.

Ruby Adair (b. Nov. 4, 1893; d. Sept. 6, 1967) married W. A. Breedlove (b. Oct. 8, 1896). They had no children and lived in Tupelo.

Hermon Adair (b. Apr. 12, 1900; d. Apr. 25. 1962) married Georgia May Dilworth, daughter of Harvey and Fammie McHaffey Dilworth. Their children are Jeanell (b. Aug. 8, 1920; d. May 5, 1963), Doris (b. Mar. 20, 1925), and Jo Ann (b. Apr. 22, 1934). This family moved to Arkansas where the daughters married and now have children and

grandchildren.

Guy Adair (b. Feb. 24, 1890; d. Sept. 14, 1966) married Jessie Maxwell (b. Oct. 11, 1890), daughter of Robert B. and Mary Frances Miller Maxwell. During his life, Guy was an active member of Gaston Baptist Church, serving several years as deacon. His wife Jessie, is the oldest member of this church, attends services regularly and faithfully supports the church. Their daughter, Mary Avis (b. July 10, 1913) married George Franklin Settle (b. Aug. 25, 1914). Their children are Raymond Adair (b. Apr. 28, 1945), Evelyn Ann (b. Sept. 20, 1946), and Edward Maxwell (b. Apr. 6, 1948). Raymond A. Settle is district soil conservationist in Tippah County, married Mary L. McGinty (b. Aug. 2, 1943) of Yazoo City, and has two sons: Raymond Adair Settle, Jr. (b. Dec. 11, 1970) and Jason Thomas Settle (b. Apr. 15, 1974). Evelyn Ann Settle is a professor in the Home Economics Dept. of East Carolina University, Greenville, N.C. Edward M. Settle is vocational agriculture teacher at Biggersville High School, married Rebecca Bassett (b. Aug. 9, 1950) of Birmingham, Ala., and has two children: Christopher Maxwell Settle (b. May 15, 1973) and Jennifer Gayle

## McHAFFEY, ROBERT

Robert McHaffey, born 1803 in Greenville County, South Carolina, son of Robert and Martha McHaffey, moved to Limestone County, Alabama while a young man. His first marriage was to Nancy Harlis in Limestone County, Alabama. She was born 1807, died 1830. To this marriage were born two children: Mary Fletcher (1828), and Jarriet Green (1830). Robert's second marriage was to Harriet (Blackburn) Philpot in 1834. She was born 1805 in Greenville County, South Carolina, and died 1884 in Prentiss County, Mississippi. Harriet and her first husband, William Philpot, were parents of three children: William, Eliza and Joseph.

To Robert and Harriet (Blackburn) Philpot eight children were born — all in Limestone County, Alabama. They were: Charlotte (1835); Jasper Hilliard (1836); Robert Newell (1838); Frances Mariean, died in infancy; Issac Newton (1842); Harriet Caroline (1845), Nancy Jane (1847), and Lucy Ann (1849).

In 1852, Robert and Harriet decided to leave Alabama and move to Texas. They equipped covered wagons with provisions for the long journey — packed utensils for outdoor cooking, several days' rations, feed for ten head of horses, and several old muzzleloading guns. With the fourteen children. they headed west, stopping briefly with Robert's oldest brother, Frank McHaffey, northwest of Booneville, Mississippi. After a brief visit, they continued westward, arriving in Texas only to find the area suffering from a severe drouth. Upon seeing the condition and remembering the fertile soil and verdant forests of Mississippi, they decided to backtrack. So, early in 1853, they returned to Mississippi and settled adjacent to brother, Frank McHaffey, northwest of Booneville

and lived in their wagons until a house could be built. That old log home stood for almost one hundred years and was known as the "Old Uncle Bob McHaffey Place".

Their children: Jimmie (1860), married Doty Milum; Jasper (1863), married Lillie Berry; Will (1866) married Mary Starling; Sallie (1869), married Bob Smith; Hattie (1871), married Jed Muzzy; Bozzy (1874) married, first, Dora Robinson, second, Pidie Robinson; Mary (1876) married Oat Presley; Dovie, born ca 1878.

Jasper Hilliard, served and died in Georgia in Civil War, 1863. He married Alcy Doty; Only child, John Hilliard (1862) married Lucy C. Weeks.

Robert Newell, died 1909 in Prentiss County, a veteran of Civil War. His first marriage was to Martha Martin, born 1836, died 1864. Children: Fannie Ellen (1862) first married Harvey Dilworth. Oscar Lee (Carroll) Adair was born 10 July 1899 in either Alabama or near Keller, Ind. Territory. He attended school through the eight grade at One Indian Creek School, often assisting the teacher with the younger students. marriage to Luevina Beauchamp he worked for many years for the railroad at Hugo, Oklahoma, where his first three children were born. They lived near the depot in Hugo; Irene was born on Clayton Street and Inez and Harold on a "letter" street. Depression years created alot of unemployment. After being "bumped" down the seniority route, Oscar found himself in the little town of Dover and finally the loss of his job. Oscar turned to farming and odd jobs to feed and clothe his young family, living in Dover and the Kingfisher area.

With the depression coming to an end and the country gearing up for World War II, Oscar saw work opportunities in the defense industry and his family moved first to Enid, then Tulsa. Stress over financial and family decisions, led to Oscar and Luevina's separation; they were divorced on August 7,1944. Oscar moved to Ft Worth, Tx. where he worked as a skilled mechanists until retirement at Convair (General Son Harold lived with his father until he joined Dynamics). the Navy, and the daughters lived with Luevina in Tulsa. Oscar had throat cancer and later suffered several strokes after his retirement in Ft. Worth. He died in Tulsa at the age of seventy five.

Luevina married Arthur Bowles and after his death, she remained in the Tulsa area, keeping busy with friends, grandchildren, crocheting and gardening until her death.

From her early childhood, Irene recalled a winter when her dad was still with the railroad, working in Tahlequah(she discovered later). Irene remembered walking beside the baby carriage holding Inez and the snow brushing the seat of her pants. Her teenage years were filled with work, from the time the family helped Aunt Artie's family picking peas, cotton, and peanuts in Arkansas, through years of work at package delivery shops and grocery stores, Irene recalled; she could hardly wait to leave the little towns like Dover and Kingfisher, where everyone knew everyone and the gossip that made life miserable for a young person wanting a little privacy. After break-up of her marriage to "Lucky" Crossley, she worked long hours supporting her two boys, assisted by mother Luevina.

After her marriage to Irvin Tudor, the two worked long hours building up the auto repair shop in Tulsa. They also became active members in Eastern Star and Mason activities. Irvin was a Worthy Patron several times and Irene achieved the status of Royal Matron in Eastern Star. Attending conventions throughout the state, Irene also represented Okla. at the Grand Chapter in Tennessee one year. She tirelessly worked at projects such as 4th of July fireworks stands for the organization's many charitable goals.

David Roberts, Ila's first husband, was raised in the Tulsa area and worked in the building construction field. Second husband Bob Bresette has one brother and four half brothers. His daughters by a previous marriage are: Claudia, Roxane, Andrea, and Danielle. Bob is a retired KC, Mo. fireman and has coached baseball at Longview Com. College in Lee's Summit, Mo. for 14 yrs. His team was 1 of 8 that went to the Junior College World Series where Bob was named Coach of the Year by his peers in 1992. Ila retired from the wholesale grocery business in 1992, following the death of her friend and employer, Mike Gargotta. Ila & Bob attend Grandview Assembly of God Church, do voluneer work, and Ila enjoys singing in the choir. Ila & Bob moved to the country on 3 acres with tons of trees in Aug 1992.

Ila's memories include her Daddy never eating the crust of bread, so she didn't either, being taken by her Daddy for a trip on a train & going for ice cream. Then he moved to Texas. Brother Harold taught her many things, like how to tie shoes. She was proud of his being in the Navy and looked forward to him coming home; He found her an Australian penpal and bought the family's first automatic car, which she drove on the way to Ft.Worth to see their daddy. Ila regretted not seeing her brother and dad more.

"Big sister Irene told me that dynamite comes in little packages - then she let me have it. Pow!! Perhaps I had borrowed something from her without asking or maybe she was having a bad day. Mother said we'd have to go in the alley if we were going to fight. But Irene was a pretty good big sister, working hard and eating cold food which amazed me." She loved avocados, eating them with nothing but salt and pepper; "I blame her for me liking them now. When she got her drivers license - oh Lord - careful and "slow" and its still careful and slow, but sure." Irene also taught her little sister to rollerskate, often taking Ila to the rink.

"I once borrowed sister Inez's make up and jewelry and she ran crying to mother for me to stay out of her things." Sister Inez washed her hair and rolled it with little round clothes pins; then she turned on the oven, and laid her head almost inside it to get her hair dry - it worked. "When she and Paul got married I sometimes spent the night with them and they taught me how to play Monopoly in their pretty little apartment over a garage."

Ila's memories of her Mother: "I almost didn't live through her mid-life. It's a wonder I have any hair left on my head. She chased me from one end to the other. When I was 13 she could sound amazingly like me over the phone to my friends." Luevina worked at a hamburger place and after school, Ila went there for a hamburger and piece of chocolate pie.

"On Saturdays I went to the show, a double feature with popcorn, root beer and candy bar, all for 50 cents. Life was sweet. Mother never learned how to ride a bicycle - she always ended up peddling backwards, and she never wore anything but dresses until the late 1960's; she didn't have a bathing suit or get into a swimming pool til 1975." Luevina was probably afraid of water and while visiting Inez's home in Alabama, she was very apprehensive about not not being able to see the bottom of the bubbling hot tub. "Precious little Mama. I miss her so much," wrote Ila.

#### Childhood Memories of Harold L. Adair

I was born in Hugo Oklahoma, but have no recollections of living there. After my birth the family moved to Dover, Oklahoma, a small town on U.S. Highway 81, between Oklahoma City and Enid. Although not remembering the move, I do recall things that happened around Dover by the house where we lived.

My earliest memories were from while we lived in the FLATS, a row type of apartments or small attached houses built on the ground without a foundation. These fronted on the East side of Highway 81, right in the middle of the down town business district and across the street from the grocery store; the flats had no front yards except the continuous porch which ran along their front, like a board-walk. One of mother's sisters or brothers also lived in one of the flats, closer to the Ice House, where Uncle Lester worked. He often gave us ice slivers which flew off large blocks being chipped into smaller ones.

Not remembering the exact order of events, one of my first memories was of embarrassment at being discovered by my mother as I sat in the small back yard and yodelled for my own pleasure. Probably she wanted to compliment me on my good voice, but I was very shy then, and didn't want the attention.

While mother talked with ladies(possibly her sisters) as they sat on the front porch, I tried to understand what they were talking about. When asked about words I didn't recognize, they gave short definitions I didn't understand and they continued talking. Daddy was in a fight with a man (perhaps a stranger) on the board walk and got his ear cut.

Mother's parents lived on a farm near Dover and it was probably while we were at the FLATS that an ice cream party was held at their house. Some of my uncles and I walked into a peanut field, (peanuts & potatoes thrived in Dover's red soil), picking peanuts from previously dug-up roots. Although warned raw peanuts caused belly aches, I ate enough to decide they weren't very tasty anyway.

It was an all day party, mostly of milling around; but about sundown everyone started making ice cream. The smallest Fchildren sat on top the freezers while older ones turned the cranks. Vanilla was the only flavor, but it was good and made your eyes hurt when bites were too big. Although it may not be an accurate recollection, it seemed the party started with a 500 pound block of ice. It was a very happy occasion which ran way into the night. Thanksgiving and Christmas dinners were the only other family parties I remember.

Near the Ice House was a filling station(or gas pumps); the pumps' glass cylinders allowed you to see how much gas was being pumped into them before you filled the car. The station's underground storage tank had a filling cap almost

flush with the ground, and a cousin used to lay down by the cap to sniff the gasoline fumes.

From the flats we moved to a farm east of Dover, as I remember. We share-cropped for the place's owner, having use of the house and part of the crop we made. Staying there probably a year, I recall hunting squirrels with daddy. When we found a squirrel in a tree, Daddy had me walk around it, causing the squirrel to move to the far side of the tree, giving Daddy a clear shot. We had no chickens, pigs or goats, so we ate squirrel & rabbit.

Having no horses of his own, Daddy used the owner's horses to plow the fields. As he led them from the barn to the fields, I rode one of them and then played under a shade tree near the fields as Daddy plowed. I spent a long time simply watching a centipede one day, being advised earlier about picking them up.

A shed with an old car (Model T) was near the house. One day Daddy and several other men were out by the car poking around and some way stirred up a mouse. In its fright the mouse ran up daddy's overall pant leg. With no belt or waist band to stop the mouse's upward journey, daddy's discomfort became visibly noticeable and he began dancing and shaking around, trying to shake the mouse out - everyone else was laughing. Another summer time recollection was of walking down a sandy road to town and feeling the hot sand burning my feet.

From that same time and place, I remember Christmas Eve and so little money an orange was considered a present. Mother had managed to buy a coconut for daddy, which she put in his shoe. A very small tool set(saw, hammer, and wrench which were each about 1 1/2 - 2 inches long) was my gift and I was keenly disappointed when the hammer was later lost.

Not long after Christmas we moved back into town(there I lost the hammer) to live across the streets from the Flats. Someone fed ground meat laced with broken glass to the small dog we had. That house had gutters and a rain barrel with a sand trap and charcoal filter. Larger than the Flats, the house had a larger back yard, but no front yard. Walking up and down the concrete front sidewalk, we picked up tinfoil from gum and cigarette wrappers, peeled off the foil and rolled it into a ball. When the ball was big enough, we took it to the junk dealer and sold it for candy money. A fine Christian lady, thinking we were trying to find cigarettes in the discarded packages, scolded us.

With the highway running at our front door, watching trucks and cars go by was a pastime, and I especially remember seeing sparks that gasoline trucks made when the steel rings running on a steel chain bounced on the pavement. With an abundance of flint stones in that part of Oklahoma, we threw (during slow traffic times) flint stones down the road, much like skipping stones on water except the stones sparked instead of splashing.

While in this house, Dover merchants held a picnic with such events as foot races, three-legged races and tow-sack races. Competing in the foot race, no one told me what the starting signal would be; my only clue to start was when everyone else started. In spite of the late start, I won first prize (probably money or candy).

A carnival came somewhere near Dover, where we watched the merry mix-up (swings on the end of a single chain that went around in a circle). Several uncles and/or aunts rode it; the next day we heard a chain had broken and someone killed. Adults talked about Uncle Bodie winning a cuppie-doll and some talk had to do with the girl he gave it to(a girl out of favor with the family).

Bodie (Mother's youngest brother) had a car and later in Kingfisher he had a new or nearly new Ford "V-8". Unsure as to when it happened, I recall a big dinner at Grandma and Grandpa Beauchamp's house on the near North East side of Kingfisher (near colored town) before they moved near the power plant. always had chicken at these dinners and the kids ate after the adults had eaten. A couple of sayings seem to be common: "Take an old cold tater and wait," and (talking about chicken parts) "I like the back, the breast, and all the rest." For some reason Uncle Bodie ate with the kids this day and he declared that his choice of chicken would be all of the chicken and he would have all the beans. Taking him at his word, I started to cry, complaining that he wanted every thing. attracted the attention of the adults and that tale was repeated for many years. Bodie had wavy black hair that he groomed frequently, always finding it necessary to tell me his hair was prettier than mine and in fact he was just all-around better looking than I was.

When Grandparents Beauchamp moved to Kingfisher, mother took us kids hitch-hiking and walking the nine miles between the towns. One day we shared a box of Cheez-it crackers as we walked down the rail road and across the bridge trestle (over the Cimmaron?). It was hot, the crackers made my mouth dry and I was thirsty, but we had no water and were just barely out of Dover.

Mother was probably doing house work for a family living off the highway southeast of Dover. I was carrying a cat in the backyard when the owner's large dog(at least bigger than I) decided it wanted the cat. My determination to not let him have the cat, resulted in the dog knocking me over and then standing over me as the cat made its escape. In the process the dog scratched my eye lid and it bled. The dog didn't seem ready to let me up, until I began to pet him. Not wanting to tell mother(I never wanted her to know if something had gone wrong), I found an old bull drum tobacco sack to use as a rag. When mother came she naturally thought the dog had bitten me.

A small scar was there for many years and now there's a slight wrinkle where the scar used to be. I was probably 4-5 yrs.old.

Part of mother's job must have been to operate and clean the cream separator(a DeLava-valve), which fascinated me. I did not attend school in Dover. Picking sand plums alongside a sandy road near the Cimmaron River is another memory of Dover.

My memory is of living in three places in Kingfisher. One home west of town, one north across the creek, and one was east of town, about three blocks from the ice plant. Living west of town we had very little food and no garden. We were so hungry that when someone brought in carrots I may have cried and mother gave me one, saying I couldn't eat it until it was washed. Not having heard those instructions before, I washed and rinsed the carrot at the wash basin. Its still soapy taste didn't keep me from eating it. Mother mother said I walked in my sleep at this home. Once an uncle brought us some fish eggs.


We moved across the creek north of town to a big house, big yard and a big garden plot. The family seemed to do better here. It was a long walk to school, although I may not have been in school yet. Memories are of playing in the creek, watching frogs and tadpoles, being carefully about snakes, and seeing a tarantula on the side walk near the blacksmith shop where I often watched the blacksmith work and the fire he used.

A barn and two garden plots were on the place east of town. The plot next to the house was a regular city building site, built on before we left. Daddy seeded that lot with alphalfa to build up the soil. The other plot was half of a city block behind the barn and between the barn and the railroad tracks. Here we had chickens and goats, very little money, but we didn't go hungry. Daddy raised enough vegetables for us to go door to door selling from a little red wagon. Mother made soap outside in a huge iron kettle which later broke when rainwater froze in it. Staying there a long time, I have many memories.

Mother had a flower garden in the front yard. Bachelor buttons were her favorite, but she also liked bright red cockscombs.





Wayland's 2 little boys has been visiting with us the last two months. They will be going back to Fort Smith this next week to get ready for school. They have been lots of help as they draw most all the water and do a lot of little things around. Saves us a lot of steps. Lots of Love to you all Kiss our Ila baby for us. Mother & All.















### JAMES ADAIR (1709-1783) (Author and Indian Trader)

James Adair's History of the American Indians was published in London in 1775, according to Samuel Cole Williams in his 1930 book Adair's History of the American Indians. James was probably of Scotch-Irish descent, coming from county Antrim, Ireland, to Charles Town, South Carolina in 1735. He first engaged in trade with the Cherokees, transferring his activities in 1744 to the Chickasaw nation in today's North Mississippi. Adair claimed credit (unrewarded, however, by S.Carolina government) in the 1750's for winning Anglo-American influence among a portion of the large Choctaw nation away from the French. Many Adair researchers feel this Adair is a son of Thomas Adair with the 3 sons.

However, this auther questions that author and Indian trader James Adair is the same James who deeded(in 1786) 50acres in Rutherford Co., NC for a courthouse and on 12 July 1791 gave 200 acres"to my beloved neice Elizabeth Moor, daughter of my brother William Adair" which indicates his relationship to Thomas Adair's sons Joseph and William Adair who settled in Laurens Dist., SC.

This James Adair of Rutherford Co., NC states in the land transaction to Elizabeth Moor that he has "no child of my own to heir and inherit my estate." (Deed Bk.G, page 66 #851).

### LIFE STORY OF JAMES WENDELL ADAIR

James Wendell Adair was born on July 15, 1934, in Moyers, Oklahoma, the first child of James Wayland Adair and Dollie Chinn Harrison Adair. He was born at the home of his paternal grandparents, James Walter (Pop) Adair and his wife, Pauline Tranquilla (Trannie or Gran) Adair. A birth certificate incorrectly gives James Wendell Adair's birth on July 20,1934, Kosoma, Okla.

One brother, Phillip Ray, was born just 18 months later, on December 13, 1935. Then two baby sisters were born, Eunice Anita Waylene, on February 2, 1937, and Nancy Drucella on August 13, 1938. Dollie contracted polio while she was carrying Waylene and after Waylene was born at a hospital in Ft. Smith, Arkansas, Dollie had to remain hospitalized for six months. During this time, Gran Adair cared for Wendell and Phillip, as well as the new baby girl, Waylene.

After Dollie was discharged from the hospital, the family moved to Ft. Smith. When Nancy was born, the family then had four children under the age of five! Dollie was ill with her polio and other health problems, so Gran Adair came to live with them. The stress of it all finally proved too much for Wayland and he left his family and divorced Dollie in 1943. Wendell was nine years old at the time, and was suddenly thrust into being the man of the house. He was very bitter toward his father for many, many years, but eventually forgave him.

Since his mother had to go to work to earn a living for herself and her four children, Wendell had a great responsibility as the oldest son. He learned to cook when he was ten years old, and soon could cook a full meal, as well as bake. Later in his life, these abilities and his experience would become an integral part of his vocational world.

Dollie was alone with her children for five years, until she fell in love with and married a career serviceman, Sgt. William S. Jones. They were married on May 18, 1948. They were assigned to a base in Alaska, and the whole family moved to Kodiak. Things were good...Dollie loved Bill very much, and so did the children. He was a wonderful husband to Dollie and good father to Wendell, Phillip, Waylene and Nancy. Unfortunately, "Daddy Bill" lost his life in a motorcycle accident on September 27, 1953.

While they were still living in Kodiak, Wendell was 17 and was ready to strike out on his own. He signed on to work as a cook and baker on LST 1072 (Landing Ship Transport) that sailed between Alaska and Seattle. When in Alaska, they would sail in the Bering Sea and make port in Nome, Kodiak, Adak, Sitka and Juneau. Probably because he felt this was a whole new chapter in his life, he decided to take his first given name, Jim, and from this time forth, he was known as Jim Adair. Only the family called him Wendell after that.

It was on one of these trips to Seattle that Jim met his future

bride, Betty Rose Hellman. His mother had asked him to look up a friend of hers on Whidbey Island while he was in town, and he met Betty on a Washington State ferry on the Whidbey Island crossing. Betty was working and living in Seattle, but she was from Whidbey Island and her parents still lived there. She was riding the ferry to visit them when she and Jim met. It was love at first sight for both of them, and the courtship progressed from February 1952, when they met, throughout the year, mostly through letters and phone calls since Jim was at sea a good deal of the time. It was always exciting for them when the LST would come into the Seattle port and they could see each other again. They married on December 20, 1952, at the Methodist Church in Langley on Whidbey Island, and settled into an apartment on Queen Anne Hill in Seattle. was working as a secretary-receptionist for a heating ventilating company in Seattle, while Jim went back to sea with the occasional trips back to the Seattle port.

It wasn't long before they were expecting their first child. As the time grew nearer for this event, they decided that it would be best if Jim didn't sail anymore, and he retired from this occupation just before Sherri Lee Adair was born on September 17, 1953. Jim was employed as a baker for Brenner Brothers Bakery at this time.

For a time, the family lived in a small rental home in the Wallingford district of north Seattle, but before long Jim and Betty bought their first two-bedroom home in Lake City, a suburb of Seattle. It was brand new and it was exciting to have their own home. Betty continued her secretarial job and though he liked his work as a baker, it didn't pay enough so Jim temporarily went back to being a cook and baker on a troop ship sailing between Seattle and Japan. It was on one of these trips that Jim was able to see his brother, Phillip, who was in the Army and stationed in Japan.

On October 13, 1955, James William Adair was born to Jim and Betty. Jim loved his little daughter, and now he had a son, too! He was very happy about this new addition to his family.

Jim again decided to try for "shore work" and became interested in selling life insurance for American National Insurance Company, based in Galveston, Texas. He did well enough his first year to win a trip to Galveston for their convention. He stayed with this occupation for three years. While working for this company, he became acquainted with a co-worker, Bob Patterson, whom he really liked, respected and admired. He was impressed by his outstanding ideals and values and the great love he had for his family. man was a Latter-day Saint. Due to his example, Jim became intensely interested in the Church of Jesus Christ of Latter-day This is not the first time the Church had entered their lives. On a trip to Oklahoma the previous year, Jim and Betty had passed through Salt Lake City, where a Book of Mormon was in the drawer of the motel nightstand. Jim was very intrigued by this book, left his donation and brought the book home with him. now he had found someone who was living the gospel and who could

tell him more about it. After taking the discussions, he and Betty decided to join the LDS Church together, and both were baptized on February 2, 1957. Jim was so excited about his church membership and before long was sustained as ward clerk. He was also happy to learn that the church feels strongly about family ties and urges its members to trace their genealogy. He began working on this project right away. He was active in the church the remainder of his life.


Their third child and second son, Robert Michael Adair, was born on October 23, 1957. With a growing family, their home was not large enough anymore and, in November of 1958, Jim and Betty bought a larger home with a nice back yard in Edmonds, Washington.



For his final test, he was sent a kit and had to build a working television set! He did it! About the same time, he and Betty discovered they were expecting their fourth child. A new home, a great job, and now a new little baby...things were finally starting to come together for them!

But he called his wife soon after, saying they had had a power failure at Boeing and they were sending everyone home. Since he loved fishing and always carried his fishing tackle with him in his car, he said he thought he'd do a little fishing before coming home, but he'd be there for Sherri's sixth birthday that evening. Later that day, Betty was notified that he had been in an automobile accident in Snoqualmie Pass and Jim wouldn't be coming home again.

Their fourth child and third son, Jeffrey Howard Adair, was born on February 8, 1960, a healthy baby and tender reminder of a love tragically taken away all too soon.

Jim is gone from this world but certainly not forgotten. His four children have felt his presence at various times in their lives and feel certain that he is lovingly watching over them. They and his 17 grandchildren know in their hearts they will see him again....someday.

# **THOMPSON**

### History of the Name

"Thompson" literally means 'son of Thom or Thomas'. Because the name is found throughout the British Isles, it was probably a popular forename from the Middle Ages, according to Thompson clan material, which further suggests Thom(p)son tends to be an English form and Thomas is usually Welsh.

Clan Tartan Centre, part of James Pringle's Woollen Mills in Edinburgh, has an established database of tartans for clan research. Viewing the many tartans and later visiting Northern Ireland in the fall of 1993, this author heard the story that some early Scottish Thompson's were accused of livestock rustling. This led to some Thompson migration to Ireland, where they dropped the "p".

Edinburgh, Scotland was the home for many prominent Thompson families; an anglicized form of Thompson is MacTavish, MacThomas and MacComie. Some Thomasons' are linked with the Clan MacFarlane and descended from a MacFarlane chief who lived c1390-1406.

From 1691-1718 Thompson families were found in several Irish counties including Derry, Down, Antrim, and Tyrone, per Charles Knowlton Bolton's book (printed in 1910) SCOTCH IRISH PIONEERS IN ULSTER AND AMERICA.

Several Thompson names appear on the petition in 1718 to Governor Shute of New England for transport to "that very excellent and renowned Plantation," wrote author Bolton. The petition hangs in the New Hampshire Historical Society at Concord.

One Thom(p)son families living in North Carolina before the Rev. War was Rev. John Thomson, born about 1690. Thomson entered the Univ. of Glasgow in Scotland in 1709 and came to "York" about 1713. Migrating down through Virginia, Rev. Thomson was perhaps the first missionary to Mecklenburg Co., N.C. He died Sep.1753 and is buried at Baker's Graveyard, according to SIGNERS OF MECHLENBURG AGREEMENT by Worth Ray. Thomson's daughter Esther married Virginian, Samuel Crockett.

Zachariah(Zacharias) Thompson born about 1730(birthplace unknown) is our earliest found descendent. Although believed to have come from Johnston Co., NC, earliest record is in Wake Co., NC. His son Jonathan married into the Mobley family which is known to have migrated from Johnston Co. to Wake Co. North Carolina about 1758.

Dick Bigbie, a Thompson descendent, found IGI Records which indicate the following: Benjamin Solomon Thompson was a son of Jonathan Parker Thompson and Pharby(Fereby) Mobley, who were married 12 January 1793 in Wake County, NC. Jonathan Thompson was born about 1768(Wake Co.) to Zachariah and Mary Thompson. Additional IGI Records reflect a Thompson/Mobley migration to Wake Co., NC from Johnston Co. NC, occurred toward the end of the 1750 decade, per Wake Co. history sources.

Zachariah Thompson deeded on 13 May 1799 162 acres on banks of Richland Creek (adjoining Frederick Holding) to son Soloman Thompson. (Wake Co.Deed Bk. Q, p. 181).

Estate Records of Wake Co., NC, 1802-1809 (Vol. 6-8, pg.96) list the estate of **Zacharias Thompson**, **dec'd**. (See following page) Executors for his estate were Jonathan and Benjamin Thompson. Dated 30 Dec 1802, the estate was shared by the **3 legatees:** Jonathan, Benjamin, and Solomon Thompson.

Bill of Sale from Mary Thompson, widow of Zachariah Thompson, to Ransom **Sutherland** for "a negro fellow named Jim, late property of Zachariah Thompson," dated 2 Oct 1800, names sons Jonathan, Soloman, and Benjamin. (Deed Bk.Q,p.374)

Jonathan Thompson and wife Pharaby Mobley on 16 Aug 1800 deeded land to Allen and Jesse Mobley (see Mobley deeds). Jonathan also witnessed deed from William Dennis to Job Rogers on 18 Oct 1800 for 164 acres on waters of Laurel & Barton Creeks and Nunns Road, part of tract granted by State of Virginia to John Humphries and "deeded down" to said Dennis. (Deed Bk. Q, p. 473). These are latest deeds found for Jonathan Thompson whose son Jonathan Parker said family went to Ohio about 1800 and thence to SC.




Another clue to Benjamin's lineage is an 1815 Lancaster Co., S.C. deed from Obediah Thompson of Mechlenberg Co., N.C. to Wm. Rowell for land on Big Lynch Creek in Lancaster Co., S.C. (This land was part of a 15,000 ac. tract granted to Gen. Sumpter in 1787). This land, referenced in two deeds signed by Benjamin S. Thompson on Nov. 22, 1830 and March 16 1839, may have been partially in Mechlenburg Co., NC.

Was Obediah Thompson, named in Mech.Co., NC deeds from 1786 related to Benjamin S. Thompson? Mech. Co. census of 1790 shows Obediah in Dist. 17 which adjoins York Co., SC. This portion of York Co. became part of Lancaster Co., SC in 1813. See map below of 1790 census districts, noting the location of Lynch's Creek. This should help locate Benjamin Thompson's two mills sold to John McManus in 1839. No deed records have been found for Benjamin S. Thompson after this date in Lancaster Co., S.C., although he was in the 1840 census and daughter Susannah was born c1839 in SC.

"At age 5 (Jonathan's) father moved to state of Ohio, where resided for 5 years and again removing, settled in Lancaster Dist., S.C. where the subject of this notice lived 37 years. At age of 22 he married Miss Sarah Croxton(dau. of John). 12 children, 10 sons and 1 daughters, 7 of whom, together with the aged mother, still reside. At 23, joined Baptist Church. In 1842 he moved with his family to Ala. and settled in Tuscaloosa Co. where he resided until time of his death. Died 18 Dec 1875 in 80th year."

Jonathan Thompson was a Baptist Minister. In 1850 J.P. Thompson and Levi Hart constituted Mt. Zion Baptist Church on Hargrove Rd. in Tuscaloosa Co. Charter members included O.J.Hall, Jennings, Nabers, Elisha Oswald, Slayton, Bruner, Hesson, and Bowen. In 1857 Rev.J. P. Thompson and J.A. Hill organized Big Sandy Baptist Church on Greensboro Highway 69. (EARLY CHURCHES OF ALABAMA by Mabel Ponder Wilson.)

After Susan's death in 1881, REW Thompson married 20 Jan 1883 in Jefferson Co., Ala. (2)Martha Emiline Clark (19 Jan 1863-23 Nov 1944). Martha, said to be part Choctaw Indian, is probably a daughter of N. M. Clark, whose tombstone at Keller Cem.(near Ardmore,Ok.) reads 5 June 1833-April 30, 1909. A memorial card in REW Thompson's trunk says she is Mrs. J.N. Clark. The Thompson family lived in the Sadler home which was built c1828 near Bessemer, Ala. Purchased in 1838 by Isaac Sadler, the home included 3000 acres and was one of 3 plantations along the scenic Eastern Valley Road in Jefferson County, Ala.

REW(Wiley) Thompson moved to Indian Terr. c1898. Oldest son Simon stayed behind in Ala. and lived many years with his grandparents Simon and Cynthia Sellers. Simon's first wife Bessie died in 1916, and their son Lester Thompson(b.1901) said he was age 10 when his father left Alabama to join other family members living near Ardmore, Oklahoma. That date of 1910 is either wrong or Bessie returned to (or never left) Ala.

Judy Sims relates the story she has heard all her life about her great great grandmother N.M.Clark who owned a "steal-dust" horse when they lived in Alabama. It seems a bunch of Indians wanted the horse and came around every night. "Grandmother brought the horse inside the log house and chained it in the corner by the chimney." The Indians could have burned the house, but didn't as they wanted that horse alive.

Wiley's family came in one covered wagon to Indian Territory. Grandson Herman Thompson has a part of a wheel from that wagon. The group included 13 children, Martha's mother. Two of Martha's brothers, Joe & Westley Clark, came too. When Westley was about 5 yrs. old, he was mauled by a billy goat, causing brain damage and mental retardation. Upon arriving in IT, the family lived in a large cellar or dug out about 1/2 mile east of the Keller Cemetary. Martha's mother "always slept in a cellar, even when they had a house," great grandson Herman Thompson said. Joseph Thompson's son Herman was born in a house near the old cellar.

Eugene Thompson's son, Richard Thompson, recalls the story his father told about the time that Wiley and Martha's dam on a pond busted. Grandma Martha was so excited she ran into the house yelling "Wiley!! the damn tank dam busted." everyone got a laugh during the crisis because this definitely was not Grandma's usual language.

Once, at a family gathering everyone was eating lunch except Grandma Martha. When Grandpa Wiley asked why, she sighed and replied "I just have to force down what I eat." Later that afternoon, Grandpa walked into the kitchen and found Grandma busily eating left-overs with both hands. He quietly said "Say, Martha, I see you're forcing down."

'A voter Registration Certificate dated 18 July 1924 indicated that REW Thompson was Irish and a Democrat, had brown hair, 5'9 1/2" tall, weight 145, "blew" eyes. One granddaughter said Wiley had a pink complexion and Martha an olive one. Martha could not write, but she read a little from the Bible. Martha said that "Wiley" watched the moon, which she seemed to think (in some way) related to the large number of children they had.

Wiley loved to tease and one day he had another man dress up like a woman so that when Martha came down to the barn she found the "woman" with her husband Wiley.

For many years, REW drove the school bus, a covered wagon pulled by horses. It also had a stove for the cold months.



Martha E. Clark's mother Nancy M. Clark, according to census data was born in Georgia. Her parents(unknown) were both born in South Carolina. She married about 1852 (Joseph or James) J. N. Clark(b. in Georgia). His father was probably Cornelius Clark, born c1783 in NC.

J.N. Clark is not listed in 1850-1880 Tuscaloosa Co., Ala. census with wife Nancy, but Nancy is first listed with Cornelius Clark, a 76 yr. old cooper from NC, in 1860. Nancy Clark is head of household in 1870 & includes 5 yr. old Martha E. Clark. By 1880 Nancy is wife of Edmond Rackley, age 55 from SC in Beat 5, Ackers Dist., Tuscaloosa Co., Ala. and has 3 additional(prob. Clark) children. REW & Martha Thompson's trunk included Rackley document below.



A. Alma May Thompson,b. 6 Feb 1921; m. 29 July 1944 in Freer,Tx., (Duvall Co.) Herman(Boy) Howerts,Jr. Alma, an only child, and Boy have no children.

Columbus and Maybelle attended the same school, but the Thompson family moved alot when the children were growing Maybelle told her daughter that she remembered sitting in the wagon seat in front of her parent's house while Columbus asked her daddy for her hand in marriage. A double wedding with Maybelle's brother Bill Finley and Ivy Knutson was planned, but Ivy may have gotten cold feet, and left on a train. Three months later Bill and Ivy married and both couples had their first children three months apart. their marriage in 1920, Columbus & Maybelle lived in an oilfield and he rode a bicycle to work. Later they lived near his parents. Maybelle recalled that Martha sold butter and fresh eggs to neighbors from a buggie, helped as a midwife and bought pretty clothes for her annual trip to the Texas State Fair in Dallas, going alone by train. Married son Ira lived there.

Clumb , Columbo, Lum, Junnie (possibly for a popular radio personality) were names people called Columbus. Clum & Alma moved to Dallas, staying a year before moving in 1926 to a farm in Ennis, Texas (south of Dallas) where daughter Alma attended Bethel grade school. Clumb was a trader and a fixer. If someone had trouble with the wall phone or something broken, they called him. Between crops he left early morning with his trailor and it was always a surprise what he brought home. He had a temper so Maybelle wouldn't let him spank Alma, who confided to needing very little discipline.

One of Ira's expressions was "When you and me and your mama married . . . . While living on the Ennis farm, Alma (now 7 yrs. old) played with a neighbor 4 year girl, who indicated her parents had been married the same number of years as Alma's. Questioning the girl's mother how long they were married before Louise was born, she said 3 yrs. Mystified by that, Alma replied that her parents were married 6 months! "I never lived that down, "wrote Alma

Selling the Ennis farm, the family moved to Freer, Texas, and Clumb worked for Cox & Hannon Oil Co. Maybelle came back to Ennis for Alma's 1938 high school graduation.

"As I grew up I was nearly as tall as mother and I called her mother. Because daddy said I had to go through 'your mother' (to get permission), I started calling her Mabel. People thought we were sisters."

When Alma married Boy, her father was delighted to get a son. It wasn't long before Clumb decided that Boy was wonderful in managing most of the many odd jobs that a household needed done, freeing Clumb "to go," because Going was one of Clumb's favorite pastimes. Once, in his later years while living near Alma, Clumb headed for Austin, but he soon phoned back for Boy to come for him. As soon as he was replenished with some needed cash, however, Clumb resumed his visit to town. Clumb died of Leukemia.

Alma recalled a visit from her grandmother Martha Thompson. Alma's mother made Martha a black silk dress and bought her a pretty straw hat. In later years Alma took Martha on her first plane ride from Corpus Christi to Grand Prairie; "all the way there, she didn't think we were really moving."


Boy, Alma's husband, worked for Humble Oil & Refining Co.(now Exxon) for 13 yrs, quitting in 1957 to own and operate Rock 'N' Wood Cottages on Lake Buchanan, largest of the Highland Lakes northwest of Austin. Boy also taught water skiing on the Lake.

An early yearning to learn about the art world led Alma into a lifelong exploration of painting. "Alma's love for people and art inspired her to seek associates with similar interest in the Buchanan Dam area," is a quote from Buchanan Arts & Crafts Hodge Podge compiled in 1985 by Buchanan Arts & Crafts of Buchanan Dam, Tx. Discovering others who shared her enthusiasm, Alma organized and was the first President of Buchanan's Arts & Crafts Co-op. Her paintings have been on exhibit in several cities and are now in many private collections.

Both Alma & Boy's mothers, who had owned homes in the same resort area, lived with them for awhile. Alma's mother died on her 82th birthday. After 25 years(1982), Boy & Alma sold Rock 'N' Wood and retired nearby. A generous lady, Alma has shared many memories, stories, and photos for this book.



**Dear Trannie & Family** 

I will try to ans your letter rec several days ago I did not ans sooner as I wanted to go to Bessemer and get the deeds you made Carr and send them to you and as I am on this subject will say that you and Sim get Lee Ray and Marie to make you all a quick claim deed for their interest in that 160 acres you know Jim did not sign the deeds as he was gone when we made them and I did not see him ali\_(alive?) any more. Well Trannie the crops are fine out here that is corn there is no cotton around here but the papers say that Alabama has one of the finest crops of corn she ever had but it is high \$2.90 per Bu. and flour \$1.90 per 24 labs. I do not know what poor people will do all the wages are good and pleanty work.(??)

I am fooling around the mines and anything I can get to do have been cutting some ties for the mines. Mr. Brackner and I cut one thousand slake ties and I have started to help WillHarkey cut 500 of them. We get 4 cts a piece and can make from 2.50 to 4.00 per day a piece but it takes so much tolive now we have had some dry weather but it began to rain yesterday and looks like there is going to be

a wet spell. Then frost I guess.

Well Trannie if I see any chance to sell that land I will do so It may be that if the TCI Co opens up on this side that I can sell it then. You can burn the deeds of Carr or keep them just as you please. Say, I have 2 of sister's pictures and if you have not got one I will send you one. With love to all As ever all are well.



## JAMES R. CARROLL (1835 - ) MARY J. DAVIS (1840 - )

Oscar Lee Adair, shown in Chapter 1, Part C as great grandson of Robert William Adair, may be the son of "Trannie" Thompson and Oscar W. Carroll (son of James R. Carroll). Only a delayed birth certificate exists for Oscar Lee Adair, showing birth July 10, 1899 in McAla, Alabama.

The only official record found for that period is the Chickasaw Nation June 1, 1900 Census in Indian Territory, which lists Trannie Carroll, living with her father and stepmother, and Oscar Carroll, a 25 year old son-in-law in Wiley Thompson's household. Oscar and Trannie have no children. James W. Adair is also listed as a boarder. One month after the census was taken, James W. Adair and Trannie Carroll were married on July 14, 1900.

Artie Adair(Oscar's Lee Adair's sister) and other family members living in the Ardmore area, suggest that Oscar W. Carroll died in an oilfield fire at Ragtown, west of Ardmore,Okla. At publication time, no record has been located for his death, but it is thought that following Oscar Lee's birth, Trannie (now a widow) married J.W. Adair, and he unofficially adopted Oscar Lee.

James R. Carroll is found in the 1880 St. Clair County, Alabama, census (Vol.21, Ed.117, Sheet 15, line 23, Beat 4 of Springfield). Preceding census for St. Clair and surrounding counties have not reflected this James Carroll, although many Carroll's are in Jefferson, Talladaga, Pickens, Tallapoosa, and Tuscaloosa Counties from 1850-1880.

James Carroll's wife Mary Davis had been previously married and had a son named John T.C. Chester. James and Mary probably married c1865 when he was about 30 yrs.old. Mary's widowed mother (Millie M. Davis) lived with them in 1880.

In Chickasaw Nation, I.T., (1900-1920) and several other southern Okla. counties, there are several Carroll individuals, but no connection has been found to James R. Carroll, born in Georgia.

# GURLEY (SIMON) SELLERS (17 Jan 1802-26 Oct 1898) DILIAH(DELLIA) WYATT (24 Apr 1805-3 July 1899)

Gurley Sellers married Diliah Wyatt in Nash Co., North Carolina on 31 Jan 1826 (NASH CO., N.C. MARRIAGES (1783-1863 by Frances I. Ingmire). This family migrated from North Carolina c1836 to Henry Co., (Southern Dist.), Ala. Gurley's two oldest sons were born in N.C., but daughter Polly H. (b. 1836) was born in Ala. Gurley probably came from Raleigh ( Nash Co.) NC. His son Simon Sellers wrote on a 1907 application for a Civil War pension, that he was born in "Roley" N.C. on May 21, 1835. Census search for Nash Co., NC reveal the following: 1790: (Halifax Dist) John, Arthur, & William Sellers Joseph, Arthur, & James Sellers(all age 26-45) John Sellers(age 45+); Arthur & James: males(-10) 1810: Joseph Sellers: Males (45+) (-10) (26-45) (Bennett??) Although she was shown as blind and bedridden (1880 census), Diliah lived another 19 years. Gurley and Delila's graves are well marked in Old Blue Cemetery adjoining Old Blue Creek Baptist Church (founded in 1857) east of present-day Bessemer, Ala. Diliah's tombstone reads:

"Mother thou wast as mild and gentle as a summer breeze"

#### AUSTIN AUGUSTUS BEAUCHAMP (1860-1941) Susanah Ann Casey (1877-1955)

Austin Augustus Beauchamp was born 8 March 1860 in Ray Co., Missouri(Crooked Riv. Twp.). He married Susanah (Susie) Ann Casey 9 July 1892 in Ft.Smith (Sebastian Co.) Ark. Austin A. Beauchamp died 24 March 1941, Kingfisher, Ok., buried in Kingfisher Cem. Austin was fair-medium complected and Susie was quiet with black hair and eyes, olive complexion. She hated foul language and became angry when her children overheard their daddy curse while shoeing a horse.

Austin and Susie's oldest son Arthur P. Beauchamp (in a 1970's interview with Karen Stein, great granddaughter of Austin A.Beauchamp), recalled that he was 11 (1905) when the family moved from Mena, Arkansas to Choctaw Nation in Indian Territory.

Mining coal was the goal of Austin Beauchamp and Britt Rodgers in their move to Indian Territory. When the mine shut down, they sought work at a sawmill, promising the owner (Lequire) that he would not have to pay them if the mill made no profit. A year later they asked Mr. Lequire to set a rail from the sawmill to the railroad to ship lumber. Proving successful, a post office was later established and the town called Lequire. Later, Sawyer and Mason asked A.A.Beauchamp to come to SansBois to build a store; with its success, the store was enlarged and a cotton gin, feed barn and hardware store were built.

Luevina Beauchamp Adair, Austin's daughter, recalled helping her dad in the logging fields, harnessing and riding the work horses as they pulled the cut trees up muddy banks and roads to the mills of southeastern Oklahoma.





JOHN CASEY (1799-1860c) Phoebe (1800-1870c)

John Casey was born 23 May 1799 in Va. His parents are believed to be Archibald Casey (born 10 Sep 1781 in Powhatan, Chesterfield Co. Va.) who married Phoebe Farmer. Robert Cayce may be his grandfather.

John Casey married Phoebe 16 March 1820 in Powhatan, Va. By 1830 this family is in Gallia Co., Ohio, staying until c1835 when they moved to Indiana where two daughters were born. Sometime before 1839 John Casey's family moved to Franklin Township (Izard Co.) Ark. Son Green Casey was born in 1844 Missouri, but last son Bennett was born in VanBuren Twp. of Crawford Co. Ark.

1850 Crawford Co. census(346-#12) lists:

Kinsey Casey married Elizabeth Ann Nave about 1870. No marriage record has been located, but Kinsey appears in the Short Mtn Twp of Logan Co., Ark. (Ed.94) of 1880 Census, which indicates that Kinsey's father was born in Indiana.

Kinsey's wife, Elizabeth Ann Nave, was born 1846, Texas (her father Wm. Nave is on 1849-1855 Lamar Co., Tx. tax roll).

Kinsey Casey probably died about 1895 when his son Joe was seven years old in Polk Co., Ark. (where last daughter Dellar was born in 1892). Elizabeth Ann Nave Casey died 7 July 1931, buried in Ross Cemetery, (Salina Twp.) Mayes Co., Ok.

"Grandma Casey(Elizabeth Ann Nave) had to go to the gris mill to get corn ground into meal. She had to go through a woods full of bushwhackers to get to the mill. When a group of them stopped her, she threatened to cut their guts out and string them all over the bushes," remembered granddaughter Opal Jones.

### WILLIAM NAVE (1815 - AFTER 1860) ELIZABETH BINGHAM?? (1826- )

William Nave ,born c1815-1820 in either Missouri or Tennessee. 1860 Census lists age as 45,born in Tenn., but 1880 lists age 59,born in Mo. Two of William's children (Elizabeth Nave Casey and William H. Nave) list their parents as born in Missouri.

First known record for William Nave(as adult) are tax records of 1850,1853, and 1855 of Lamar Co., Texas. He paid poll tax of \$50, state tax of \$25(1850). In 1855 he paid \$75 poll tax and \$50 state tax. No real estate tax was paid.

About March 1860 William Nave left Texas(after son Tho.R. Nave was born) for Franklin Co. Ark. (Middle Twp., Aza P.O.). Franklin Co. Ark. (#823-788) July 10th, 1860 census: William NAVE(age 45-Tenn); Elizabeth (33-Tenn); Eliza Nave (11-Tx); William H. (8-Tx); James A.(7-Tx); Thomas R.(3/12-Texas).

Last record found for William Nave is June 1880 Logan Co., Ark. (Stone Mtn #97/31-2) where he is listed with son T.R. Nave. William Nave (now age 59 and blind) gives Georgia as birthplace for his parents. Living nearby is son William H. Nave and daughter Elizabeth Nave Casey. (#94-287).

The best candidate for William's parents is Jacob Nave, who moved by wagon from Cocke Co. Tenn to Saline Co., Missouri about 1816 with brother Henry Nave. (Isaac & Abram Nave came c1820). Jacob Nave's wife, Elizabeth Thornton, was also from Tenn. Jacob Nave had about 11 children; Son Jesse moved to Livingston, Mo. where he founded in 1836 the town of Navestown, later renamed Spring Hill(Jackson Twp). Jesse Nave was on the Republic of Texas 1846 Poll List in Cass Co., Tx. On July 12,1871 heirs of Jesse Nave from Livingston Co., Mo. gave deed to 960 acres on Sanders Creek, 12-14 miles "west of north" from Paris, Tex. in Lamar Co.

Thus it seems that brothers Jesse and William Nave were in this NE Texas area about 1846. Family legend states William Nave married Elizabeth Bingham. Supporting this theory, John Bingham is next to Jacob Nave(1830 Saline Co., Mo. census) with a daughter matching Elizabeth's age. John & Mary Bingham donated 20 acres in Saline Co., Mo. for a townsite named New Philadelphia, later changed to Arrow Rock. Wyatt Bingham is mentioned as 1820 settler in Cambridge Twp. of Saline Co.



Feb 16, 1918

I will answer your kind and welcome letter which I received a few days ago. I was sure glad to hear from you. We are all well. Leonard and Oscar are plowing.

Well Lumb don't kiss that girl to much. Tell old Walt to write to me.

Have you all broke any land yet. We have broke 14 acres of corn land. Tell Buster the first time you see him that I said for him to not run his car to fast.

Lumb I wish you could come down here. we would have a time playing ball and kissing the girls. I have got me two girls down here. They both come to school every day. One of my girls has got to much gall, the other has not got enough gall.

Tell grandpa I said that the grass was getting green down here. tell him I said to bring his cows down here and turn them a loos on the range. Well I guess I had better close.

### Feb 27, 1918

Dear Uncle, I will write you a short letter to let you know how all is getting along. All is well enough to eat. How is all up there? They was a little baby died here the other night and a little boy six years old died the other day. The baby belong to Mr. McClain, it died the night it was born. The little boy belonged to Mr. J.A. Burk.

Well, what are you doing all thus time? I am sitting around and going to school. We havent broke any land yet. everything is froze here.

Tell the other boys I said to write. Excuse all bad writing and my crooked lines. It is about nine oclock so I will close, good bye answer soon from Homa" (Letter was written on hand-drawn lines).

#### 30 March 1918

Dear Uncle I will answer your letter received the other day. J.W. was glad to hear from you. I am well and hope you the same. Well, Lumb we have planted our corn. Mamma has got a fine garden. Say Lumb why dont you come down here. We would have a time.

Well Leonard got out of his fine - he is 25 miles from here now hunting cows. Oscar said for you boys to write to him. Well I will close, answer soon from your nephew.

June 13 1918

Dear Uncle, How are you all getting along? We are all well. Say Lumb why havent you ans my letter that I wrote I have looked for a letter a long time. Say Leonard run off from home. Will ans your letter I just rec today was glad to here from you all Sorry you all could not come to the fair. It rained a little sunday and heavy cloudy but I never saw such of a crown in my life as there was at the fair Park from the gate to the mamoth racer you could not hardly walk the people was so thick and besides they was scatered all over the Park and I saw some shure enough auto races.

We have been out there 2 times since it has been going on it has rained most of the time but every time it lets up they put in good time; there is lots to see out there every thing you could think of and more that I could tell about in 15 minutes. We seen 2 Battles they pulled off imitation the European War it shure was a site to see. They had it at night it was pretty and exciting it was just a solid blaze allmost and the big guns went so loud they would shure shake you up. The kids shure did injoy it. the pretyist fire works you every saw and the most of it.

Well, if you want to see the rest you will have to come down if the weather clears up the best is yet to come, I guess. You ask how the weather was here it rains every day nearly, it is knocking me out of work to and I miss that \$7.00 to. Say you said you wrote Emmar a letter and set it to our house. We did not get it. They wont send it out here unless you send it in care of me or Millie.

I forgot the fair ends the 19teenth. Lum, see if you can find a buyer for that Piano down at Reerees(?) for \$150 if you can sell it you can have all over that. you get cash. ans. soon.

We will tell Emmer and she can call at the office and get it. Tell Ma she did not see no crowds at all at the Park when she was here to what they are now.

## To Marnie June 29 1921 From: Mother(?)

Dear Marnie I recived two letters from you yesterday I mean one from you and one from Unian. Was glad to hear for it was the first time since you left I had walked to Charlies mail box any way since I never hear and didnt get anything from you and yesterday Challie went over home and found five letters in the box at the house for me. So you see I got lots of news. I got the two from you and one from Elmer and Lyda and one from Eddie and Myrtle and one from Walter he said he was feeling fine and had got to be a white man again and hadnt taken a dose of medican since he left hear and Elmers was all well and liked Norman fine. Eddie has boils all over his arms and hands.

Well, and little Jack has a tooth. (?) Hury up and get your visit out and come home for I want to see Jack. It shure is lonesom out hear but Challie warts me to stay out here with Ethel as he is going off now in a few days so far he can not come back every nights. So I guess I will haftto stay. I didnt rent any of the rooms out. Several came to look at them befor I left our things your old Mat came to rent them but he said he had five kids so I turned him down. haha. I am feeling very well today but was almost been sick yesterday.

Yesterday was the big Drawing day in Manger. Challie said he newer saw so many people in Manger as they had yestday and Mr. Andy Parker drew the car and first prise of fifty dollars.....
